Introduction and WIIFM

- Families will likely find discussion of financial needs uncomfortable, but will share because it means they can be a child's forever family.
- Adoption subsidies have helped to alleviate financial obstacles and barriers in considering adoption (Child Welfare Information Gateway, 2011).



•	Adoption assistance negotiation is required by rule 5101:2-4-05. Applying this definition to adoption subsidy negotiation, agencies should have a discussion with the family about their financial barriers to adopt, and then work together towards a mutually acceptable subsidy amount that will meet the child's needs.

Values and Beliefs of Adoption Subsidy

- The potential benefits of subsidy include: Leads to permanency, enhances the child's well-being, saves agency and state money.
- Negotiating a 0.00 subsidy is needed at times and is referred to as Deferred Adoption Assistance.
- There is a mandate to distribute the subsidy information with all family inquiries which can be met in the distribution of JFS 01985.



Adoption Subsidy Programs



- The four Adoption Subsidy Programs are: Title IV-E Adoption Assistance, State Adoption Maintenance Subsidy, Nonrecurring Adoption Expenses Subsidy, and Post Adoption Special Services Subsidy.
- The AFDC-eligibility requirement will be completely phased out by 10/1/17, making all adoptees eligible for the federal subsidy. SAMS will continue to serve those currently qualified.
- Other laws that affect adoption subsidy include the Interstate Compact on Adoption and Medical Assistance Program, The Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978, and Non-discrimination laws.

Steps in Subsidy Negotiations



- Steps in the negotiation process
 - Exploration
 - o Information Exchange
 - Clarification
 - Closing and Commitment

Role of the Assessor in Negotiations



- Assessors should be familiar with ODJFS rules and ORC and OAC codes regarding subsidy and adoption.
- Assessors working in a PCSA will need to document any discussions of subsidy that occur with a family within the SACWIS sytem.
- Assessors can support a family in the negotiation process by providing information and tools such as a financial planning guide.
